### **I. Call to Order**

The Regular Board meeting of the Mississippi State Board of Examiners for Licensed Professional Counselors (“Board”) was called to order at 9:03 a.m. by Dr. Richard Strebeck, Chair (“Chair”) on Friday, August 23, 2019. The meeting was held in the Robert E. Lee Building, 239 North Lamar Street, Suite 402, Jackson, Mississippi 39201. A roll call of Board members was taken and a quorum was present. A determination vote for an Executive Session may be called at any time during the meeting.

### **II. Board Operations**

#### **A. Minutes Approval**

It was motioned by Etheridge, seconded by Stafford, and unanimously agreed that minutes of the June 26, 2019, Regular Board meeting via Telecom be approved as presented. 4-0

## **B. Conflict of Interest Declarations**

As required by the Rules and Regulations (Rule 3.1(C)(9)), each Board member signed the Mississippi State Board of Examiners for Licensed Professional Counselors Conflict of Interest Declaration

## **III. Financial Matters**

### **A. Travel Vouchers**

It was motioned by Stafford, seconded by Etheridge, and unanimously agreed to approve travel vouchers for the August 23, 2019, Board meeting. 4-0

### **B. Cornerstone 4982-b Invoice**

The Board reviewed Invoice 4982-b presented by Cornerstone Consulting in the amount of \$2000 for routine expenses.

### **C. AASCB Membership Fee**

It was motioned by Stafford, seconded by Sallis, and unanimously agreed to pay the AASCB State Board Membership dues of \$450 per person, for a total of \$900, for attendees at the Conference held in Washington, DC on August 8-9, 2019, which was previously approved by the Board. 4-0

### **D. Financial Report**

The Board reviewed the Financial Report. The Board has a total budget of approximately \$189,000. Total cash on hand is \$394,000 which pays for the FY expenditures. The next FY budget was submitted for approval on August 1, 2019.

### **E. Invoice-Waller**

Mr. Walley recommended the Board adopt a policy which allows Board to only accept billing invoices in increments of .10 of an hour (which equals 6 minutes), and requires the invoice to include the activity performed, the purpose of the activity, and how the activity furthered the purpose of the invoice.

It was motioned by Stafford, seconded by Sallis, and unanimously agreed to request Dr. Waller to submit a redacted invoice to the Board that includes increments of .10 of an hour for billing, the activity performed, the purpose of the activity, and how the activity furthered the purpose of the invoice. 4-0

## **F. MCA Registration**

1. It was motioned by Strebeck, seconded by Stafford, for the Board to have a display table/Vendor booth at MCA at a cost of \$400 for the time periods of 8:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, November 6, 2019 and 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, November 7, 2019. The motion failed to pass. 0-4
2. It was motioned by Stafford, seconded by Etheridge, and unanimously agreed to pay Registration Fee, hotel, and travel expenses to MCA for all Board Members, the Executive Director, and the Board Attorney from November 5-8, 2019. 4-0
3. MCA will be held in the Convention Center in Biloxi, MS from November 6-8, 2019. The Board's proposal for the presentation has been submitted to and accepted by MCA. The Board will present in two one-hour time slots beginning at 8:00 a.m. on November 8, 2019.

## **G. Federation of Association of Regulatory Boards (FARB)**

It was motioned by Sallis, seconded by Stafford, and unanimously agreed, to honor Mr. Walley's request for the Board to pay up to one-half (\$1015) of the requested estimated travel expenses of \$2035 for Mr. Walley to attend the Federation of Association of Regulatory Boards legal seminar to be held in St. Louis, MO on October 3-6, 2019. 4-0

## **IV. Old Business**

### **A. Update on AG opinion regarding 73-30-29**

1. The request for an AG opinion regarding the discrepancies in 73-30-29 concerning the fees for P-LPC renewals and the number of CEH required for renewal was submitted by the Chair of the Board on August 21, 2019. The response from the AG is expected within 3-4 weeks.
2. The Board reviewed the discrepancies in the proposed Statutes in comparison to the Rules and Regulations and intent of the Board. The following was discussed:
  - 73-30-29
    - Remove fee amount and set language indicating fee will be set by the Board
    - Separate language for LPCs and P-LPCs and make one subsection for LPC and one subsection for P-PLC to decrease confusion
  - 73-30-9(a)
    - Change language from licensing fee to application fee
  - 73-30-9(1f)
    - Remove Statute 73-30-5 reference
  - 73-30-9(i)

- Remove references to dollar amounts and add “as set by the Board”
- Clarify the licensing fee is for full licensure as an LPC
- Clarify the annual renewal fee is for P-PLC until application is made for full licensure
- 73-30-9(j)
  - Reword the requirements for fingerprint-based criminal history records check of the MS criminal database and the FBI criminal history database to clarify that all applicants for licensure must complete this criminal history check.
  - Change requirements also to include: Each renewal applicant shall subscribe to this criminal history check as required by the Board.
- 73-30-9(2a)
  - Delete the amount reference
  - Delete the word “licensing”
- 73-30-9(2f)
  - Remove Statute 73-30-5 reference
- 73-30-9(2i)
  - Reword the requirements for fingerprint-based criminal history records check of the MS criminal database and the FBI criminal history database to clarify that all applicants for licensure must complete this criminal history check.
  - Change requirements also to include: Each renewal applicant shall subscribe to this criminal history check as required by the Board.
- 73-30-29(1)
  - Separate paragraphs for LPC and P-LPC regarding renewal and CEH
  - P-LPC
    - September 30 renewal period
    - Annual renewal
    - Six hours of CE total with two hours in legal or ethics
    - Renewal Fee of \$50 per year – remove references to amount from Statute and indicate Renewal Fee as prescribed by the Board
  - LPC
    - Remain same regarding CEH and Renewal requirements
    - Remove references to amount from the Statute and indicate as prescribed by the Board

Mr. Walley will make the discussed revisions to the Statute and send to the Board members for review

The Board reviewed updates on status per Agreed Order for the months of July, 2019 and August, 2019.

**C. 2018-36 Hogue, Jennifer (#2171)**

It was motioned by Strebeck, seconded by Etheridge, and unanimously agreed, to acknowledge the completion of the terms of the Agreed Order. 4-0

**D. Jurisprudence Examination**

The Board members were given login information to the Jurisprudence Examination as completed by NBCC and will pilot the exam before implementation.

**E. Website**

There was nothing presented to the Board for review. Strebeck will follow-up with IT.

Board members who attended the NBCC/AASCB meeting in Washington, DC in August 2019 provided a short summary of information gleaned from the meeting.

**D. Mississippi College Career Summit Invitation**

The Mississippi College Counseling Program is sponsoring a Career Summit for student on November 1, 2019, and has requested a representative from the LPC Board participate in the Career Professionals Panel. Stafford volunteered to participate.

**E. Northwest MCA Regional Meeting**

Sallis will present at the NW MCA Regional Meeting held at Northwest Community College on September 20, 2019 regarding the process of the P-LPC licensure requirements and supervision requirements.
